Challenging the traditional conventions surrounding the concept of a narrative, modern American literature has established new poetics of storytelling. It is the relationship between the narrator and the story and between the author and his audience that opens new modes of theoretical exploration. The very act of defying the conventional narrative raises questions about the condition of storytelling in modern and contemporary literature. We are interested in ways in which American authors question the structural aspects and strategies of storytelling. We cordially invite B.A., M.A. and Ph.D. students to submit conference papers (approx. 20-minute presentations) on American literature, theater, film and art, concerning (but not restricted to) the following issues:

- Storytelling
- Antinarrative
- Visual narrative
- Narrative poetry
- Narrative realism in the twenty-first century
- Multi-narrative
- Non-Western traditions of storytelling: e.g. African American, Chicana, Asian American literature

- Narrative as a tool linking generations
- HIStory, HERstory
- Drama and narrative
- Art and narrative
- Myths
- Narrative perspectives and techniques
- Temporality and narration
- Literary genres and modes of narration
